Contemporary Art Collection

The collection is always looking to find new works in order to better represent the Europe of today and its artists. Founded by Simone Veil in the 1980s, it seeks to inspire reflection, promote intercultural discussion and embody the European Union's motto of 'United in Diversity'.

The collection's recent additions have been carefully selected from visual artists across the continent who are fast gaining international recognition, and showcases mediums such as photography, drawing, sculpture, installation and graphic art. These pieces address some of the most important issues in our society and challenge and invite the viewer into a dialogue with the work and its subject matter.

The collection currently contains over 500 artworks from all 27 EU Member States and beyond. In an effort to reach gender-balanced representation in the collection, work from female artists has been prioritised in recent acquisitions. The collection is managed by the Art Collection Service (DG Communication, Civil Society Outreach Unit).
